SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Gerome

September 30 Memorial



Most of the saints are remembered for some outstanding virtue or devotion, but Jerome is remembered for his bad temper! This was so true and he also used a mighty sarcastic and caustic pen on anyone who taught error about the faith. He was above all a Scripture scholar, translating most of the Old Testament from the Hebrew into Latin. He also wrote commentaries which are a great source of scriptural inspiration for us today. He was an avid student, a thorough scholar, a prodigious letter writer, and a consultant to monk, bishop, and pope. Saint Augustine said of him, "What Jerome is ignorant of no mortal has ever known." Saint Jerome is particularly important for having made the translation of the Bible which came to be called the Vulgate. Its acceptance by the Church was fortunate; as a modern scholar says, "No man before Jerome or among his contemporaries and very few men for many centuries afterwards were so well qualified to do the work." The Council of Trent (1545-1563) called for an updated edition of the Vulgate and declared it the authentic text of the Church. Jerome was a master of Latin, Greek, Hebrew, and Chaldaic. His studies began at his birthplace, now Croatia. He went on to Rome, then Germany and eventually to Palestine, where he spent five years in the desert. He settled in a cave in Bethlehem and died there on September 30, 420. Jerome was strong, outspoken, swift to anger, but swift to feel remorse. Upon seeing a painting of Jerome striking his breast with a stone, a pope once remarked, "You do well to carry that stone, for without it the church would never have canonized you."

Our First Reconciliation class met last week to learn about The 10 Commandments. They discovered meaning for each of them that a young person can understand. We have 8 energetic young parishioners who are making their way to this wonderful sacrament in November!

Our Confirmation class spent several hours last week studying the Eucharist, the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ, Who is the source and summit of our faith. This weekend they will be in an all day retreat ending with an outdoor Mass in Varysburg. There, they will formally promise to pursue this Sacrament that carries them into adult membership in our Church! Please continue to keep them in your prayers. Bishop Grosz has notified our parish that he will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation in Attica on Sunday, November 1, 2020, at 11 am Mass. More information in the weeks ahead.

Our Family Faith Formation gathering, following outdoor Mass on Saturday, will include an overview of the year ahead, initial family registration, as well as on-site and take-home activities for everyone. WHAT ARE THE SEVEN DEADLY SINS?

Church teaching identifies and cautions against seven particularly harmful sins. They are sometimes referred to as "capital" sins — meaning "most serious or influential" because they lead to and reinforce all sorts of other sinful actions, thoughts, and omissions. The sins are deadly in that they increase our tendency to sin and cause us to turn away more and more from God. For example, the capital sin of envy can lead to spreading rumors about people who have more than you do or to lying or stealing to get the things you want. Here is a list of the seven deadly sins with present day definitions. (1) Pride: Believing you are better than others, often resulting in despising or disrespecting others. (2) Avarice: Greediness, hoarding money and things. (3) Envy: Resentment that we direct at others who have some success, thing, or privilege that we want for ourselves. (4) Wrath: Strong anger that makes us want to seek revenge and prevents reconciliation. (5) Lust: Undisciplined, unchecked desire for selfenjoyment, especially of a sexual nature. (6) **Gluttony**: Excessive eating or drinking. (7) Sloth: Habitual laziness, failing to put forth effort and take action.

Do you struggle with any of these sins? Have you noticed in your own experience that these seven sins make it hard to resist other sins? Excerpted from The Catholic Faith Handbook
