

### SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. John Henry Newman October 9 Memorial

John Henry Newman has been called the "absent Father of Vatican II" because his writings on many topics were extremely influential in shaping the Council's documents. He is known as the 19th century's most im-



portant English-speaking Catholic theologian. But he was first the most famous intellectual in the Church of England when he shocked all of Great Britain by converting to the Catholic faith. Born in London, he studied at Oxford's Trinity College and was vicar of the university church for 17 years. Historical research made Newman suspect that the Roman Catholic Church was in closest continuity with the church that Jesus established. In 1845, at age 44, he became Catholic and was ordained a priest in Rome two years later. He lost many friends because of his decision. Returning to England he founded many Oratory houses and then served as rector of the University of Ireland for seven years. Newman eventually wrote 40 books and 21,000 letters survive today. He accepted Vatican I's teaching on papal infallibility while noting its limits, which many were reluctant to do. He was a keen critic of the liberalism of his day. He had little patience for the "twobottle orthodox," self-indulgent Anglican pastors whose "greatest religious zeal manifested itself in drinking to the health of 'the Church and King.'" For Newman, the key to conscience is that it is well formed with study, docility and humility. In 2010 Pope Benedict XVI beatified Newman. He noted his emphasis in the vital place of revealed religion in civilized society, but Benedict also praised his pastoral zeal for the sick, poor, bereaved and imprisoned. #### **FAITH FORMATION NEWS**

Monday 10/4 at 6:30 is our first Faith Formation gathering in St Vincent's Aud. It also happens to be the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. In 1121 he was born into a wealthy family and named Giovanni. He enjoyed traveling with a musical troop, entered the military, and was captured during wartime. After spending a year in prison, Francis was released and heard God's call to "Build His Church." Francis left the life of wealth and comfort, started the religious order today called the Franciscans, and devoted the rest of his life to serving the sick and poor. He taught everyone about God's love and had a deep appreciation of Creation and Creator. He is known as the Patron Saint of Animals and Ecology. We often sing the Prayer of St. Francis at the Offertory. This week, take time to recite this beautiful prayer of peace, patience and understanding with your family.

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace;

Where there is hatred, let me sow love;

Where there is injury, pardon;

Where there is doubt, faith;

Where there is despair, hope;

Where there is darkness, light;

And where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive, and it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

CAN A DIVORCED PERSON SERVE AS EUCHARISTIC MINISTER?

Yes, a divorced person can serve as an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, and they would not need to have their marriage annulled first. They would need to do that only if they wanted to remarry. There is a fair amount of misunderstanding among Catholics who have been divorced—some times through little or no fault of their own—feel that they have thereby separated themselves from the Church and may even stop coming to Mass. But, says the website of St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Niagara Falls, "Catholics who are separated or divorced, and who have not remarried outside the Church, are in good standing in the Church and can receive the sacraments, including Holy Communion. They are encouraged to fulfill their Catholic commitment by attending Mass on a weekly basis...[and] to fully participate in all aspects of parish life. [They] are invited to serve in any ministries—including lector, Eucharistic Minister and catechist. [They] may serve as Godparent for Baptism or sponsor for Confirmation. Catholics who are separated or divorced are not excommunicated." Similarly, St. John Paul II said in his 1981 apostolic exhortation Familiaris Consortio: "I earnestly call upon pastors and the whole community of the faithful to help the divorced, and with solicitous care to make sure that they do not consider themselves as separated from the church, for as baptized persons they can, and indeed must, share in her life (No.84)."

As we enter October, the month dedicated to the rosary, we encourage the faithful to pick up their rosaries and pray to Our Lady for an end to the pandemic and for her to wrap the world in her mantle. "All of us turn to our moms when we are struggling or facing a challenge," said Pope Frances, who asked us to pray to Mary, Health of the Sick, Mother of Divine Love. We seek refuge under your protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our pleas—we who are put to the test—and deliver us from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin!
